disabled since the
action of his appli-
cation should be
plainly stated.

TAKE NOTICE.—The affidavit should, if possible, be in the handwriting of the affiant; the marginal instructions should be carefully observed before writing out the statement. All the facts in possession of affiant as to the origin and course of the disability should be fully set forth, and the dates of treatment should be specifically given.
