

Act of June 27, 1890.

DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION.

To be executed before a Court of Record or some officer thereof having custody of its seal, a Notary Public or Justice of the Peace, whose official signature shall be verified by his official seal, and in case he has none, his signature and official character shall be certified by a Clerk of a Court of Record, or a City or County Clerk.

State of Maryland, County of Dorchester, ss:

On this 13th day of July, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, personally appeared before me, Wm R Hayward

a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid,

Robert Stafford, aged about 60 years, a resident of the Town of Cambridge, County of Dorchester,

State of Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is

the identical Robert Stafford, who was ENROLLED on the 23rd

day of September, 1863, in Co A 7th Reg. U. S. C. Troops (Here state rank, company, and regiment in Military service, or vessel, if in the Navy.)

in the service of the

United States in the war of the rebellion, and served at least ninety days, and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED at

Baltimore, on the 22nd day of January, 1866.

That he has never been employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above.

(Here state what the service was, whether prior or subsequent to that stated above, and the dates at which it began and ended.)

That he is partially unable to earn a support by manual labor by reason of an affection

of the eyes (for which he was discharged and is injured from which disabled.)

now receiving a pension) -

That said disabilities are not due to his vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief permanent. That he has

applied for pension under application No. That he is a pensioner under Certificate No.

(If a pensioner, the Certificate number only need be given. If not, give the number of the former application if one was made.)

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States, under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890.
