To the Adjutant General, U. S. Army.

Sir: I have the honor to return herewith the papers received from your office in pension claim No. 511415, with such information as is furnished by records filed in this office, viz: that R. Gafford, Private C. A. & U. S. I. was admitted to Point of Rocks Hospital, Army of the James, Point of Rocks, Va. Dec. 16, 1864 with Diarrhoea, and returned to duty Jan. 8, 1865, that Robert Stafford, Private said Co. and regt. was admitted to Flying Field Hospital 25. A. C. May 10, 1865 with sore eyes and transferred May 12, 1865, that he was admitted to Point of Rocks Hospital Army of the James May 12, 1865 diagnosis not stated and transferred May 14, 1865, that he was admitted to G. H. Fort Monroe, Va. May 14, 1865 with Conjunctivitis, and transferred Oct. 20, 1865, and that he was admitted to Hicks G. H. Baltimore, Md. Oct. 28, 1865 with Obstruction of Nasal duct, diagnosis also stated 'obstruction of left nasal duct' and discharged from service Jan. 22, 1866. Remarks discharged on Surg. 2<sup>nd</sup> Certificate of Discharge.
