On this 29 day of March, 1899, at Annapolis, county of Anne Arundel, State of Md., before me, H. H. Lockwood, a special examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared.

Thomas Sarah, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this special examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

I am 70 years of age; my post-office address is Clay st this city. I have no trade I only do light jobs. I enlisted in Co H. 30 u s v s t and was transferred into the U. S. Navy.

I knew this claimant since he was a small chap - we grew up together & visited together. I knew him then by the name of Ned Tasker. & this is the only name I ever knew him by. The man I now know as Edward Tasker is the same person I knew as a boy and enlisted in the army with me but I don't now know what name he served under but I do know that he is the same man who enlisted the same time I did & now & always did go by the name of Ned Tasker. I know he was transferred into the Navy but did not serve in the same vessel I did. I was on the Mahash. but I saw him while at Ft Fisher & knew him to be the same person I knew as a boy but I can't now recall what vessel he served on & don't know if he served in any other name but Edward Tasker.

I don't recall if I ever made an affidavit in his claim for pension.

I do now recall that I did make a statement for him in his pension claim.
