Sirs:

In the above-entitled claim for increase of pension, under the Act of June 27, 1890, you are informed that the affidavit of Dr. Joseph L. Johnson, filed March 13, 1905, has been carefully considered and compared with all the evidence, including the reports of medical examinations in the case, but that it fails to show that there has been an increase of claimant's incapacity for earning a support by manual labor since March 7, 1904, date of his examination by a board of surgeons, upon the report of which a claim for increase was rejected September 22, 1904, it being shown that he was not incapacitated for earning a support by manual labor in a degree entitling him to a pension in excess of eight dollars per month, which he is now receiving.

For reasons stated, an order for medical examination is not warranted, and will not be issued in his claim for increase, filed November 19, 1904.
