to be Edward Jaker - I may have made a statement in this case as long ago as 1893 but I don't now recall it after listening to this statement as now read to me I must say that I have no recollection of having made such a statement for I did not know this claimant till after the war & never knew him by any other name than he now bears.

I am the only Thomas Jones living here who served in the same company & regiment with me - there were others by the name of Jones but none of them live here. I know that this claimant goes by the name of Edward & this is the only name I ever knew him to go by. I don't know any thing about his army service only as I learned it from him in connection with my Grand Army Post. I know that this man has now removed to Washington D.C. he used to live on the same street with me in this city. I can't give his present street & number in that city.
