It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that John Johnson (Pvt) was enrolled on the 23rd day of September 1863, at Talbot Md., in Co. "A",

7th Regiment of U.S. Colored Troops Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 26th day of September 1863, at Baltimore Md, in Co. "A",

7th Regiment of U.S. Colored Troops Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "I" of that Regiment, for the months of September & October 1864, he is reported "Absent wounded since October 13, 1864." On Muster-roll of his Co. for the months of November & December 1865, he is reported "Discharged at Fort Monroe Va October 20 1865. on Surgeons certificate of Disability."
