I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. _____, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office. In reply to your inquiry of July 21^d 1866

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that John Johnson was enrolled on the 23^d day of Sept., 1863, at Galber Md. in Co. "A", 7th Regiment of W. V. Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Pvt. on the 26^d day of Sept. 1863, at Baltimore Md. in Co. "A", 7th Regiment of W. V. Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "A" of that Regiment, for the months of Sept. and October 1864, he is reported "Absent wounded since Oct. 13^d 1864." - on Rolls for Nov. and December 1865 - "Discharged at Fort Monroe Va. Oct. 20^d 1865. on Surgeon's Certificate of disability"
