

AFFIDAVIT FOR Neighbors' and General Purpose.

In the matter of Mary Jane Smith Widow of William Smith private of company to 7th Regt. U.S. I.

ON THIS 25th day of March A. D., 1884, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace in and for the aforesaid county, duly authorized to administer oaths Thomas Henson aged 65 years, a resident of Cambridge Md and Leasey Henson aged 55 years, a resident of Cambridge Md,

well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who being duly sworn, declare in relation to aforesaid case as follows:

That they knew William Smith before he enlisted and knew him after his discharge and until the time of his death, and can positively say that he was disabled on account of rheumatism for the performance of manual labour each year from discharge to the date of his death and are satisfied that it prevented him from manual labour at least one half; many times for days he was not able to do any thing and they know this from our intimate acquaintance with him and living in the same town
