 said apprenticeship and to send his said apprentice to a good
 English day school six months during his said apprenticeship
 and to send his said apprentice to a good English day school

 free to give him fifteen dollars in money or clothing at the
 option of said apprentice.

 nineteenth day of December eighteen hundred and forty will be
 of the age of six years the daughter of Susan Miller of the said
 County of indigent circumstances with the consent and approbation
 of the said Susan Miller testified by her ailing and believing them
 proper to unite said Jeremiah Ellison to learn the art and mystery
 of house Keeping and spinster after the manner an apprentice the
 said Mary Miller to dwell with and serve the said Jeremiah
 Ellison from the date of these presents until the twentieth day
 of December nineteen hundred and forty two during all which time
