Sirs:

Relative to the above-entitled claim for pension, you are advised that if claimant desires to claim pension for the child Emory, she should state, under oath, the day, month and year of his birth and how she is able to fix such dates, and furnish an affidavit from the attending physician, or if that cannot be obtained, the testimony of female attendants who can state how they are now able to fix the day, month and year, showing the date of said child's birth, and the testimony of credible witnesses, showing whether he is living or lived to attain the age of sixteen years. If he has died, the date of death should be proved.

If claimant is unable to comply with the requirements herein indicated, or any part thereof, she should state the fact and reasons, under oath.
