

ACT OF JUNE 27, 1890.
DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

To be executed before a Notary Public, Justice of the Peace, or any officer competent to administer oaths.

State of Maryland, County of Charles, ss:

On this 21st day of August, A. D., one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the county and State

aforesaid Mary Louisa Butler, aged 55 years, a resident of the 8th of E. St, county of Charles, State of

Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of Richard Butler, who enlisted under the name of Richard Butler at Benedict, on the 24th day of October 1863, A. D. 1863, in Comp'y E. 7 Reg't W. S. C. I. Vol. Infantry (Here state rank, company, and regiment, if in Military service, or vessel, if in Navy.) as private

and served at least ninety days in the late War of the Rebellion, who was HONORABLY DISCHARGED at Fort Monroe, and died on the 24th June 1894 (The cause of death need not be stated.)

That she was married under the name of Saint Joseph's Church, to said Richard Butler, about 36 years ago or thereabouts 18 , by Father Cotton, at there being no legal barrier to said marriage.

(If there was a former marriage of claimant or her husband, state it here and

That she has not remarried since the death of the said Richard Butler (Name of soldier or sailor.)

That she is without other means of support than her daily labor. That names and dates of birth of all the children now living under sixteen years of age of the soldier are as follows:
