He is reported on Muster Roll from origin to Feb'y 28th 1865 -
present for duty. Mch & Apr. Absent
sick since Mch 27th 65 May & June
and July & Aug Absent sick since
May 21st 1865.

He was mustered out June 5th 1865 -
at Fort Monroe Va. a Patient in Hosp.
under order of War Dept. dated
May 3rd 1865, as shown by Indd.

Mrs. Cut Rall.

Company was in action Deep Bottom
Aug. 15th 64.

Reg'tal Hosp'l Records show him
treated Mar. 10 to 12, 65 for Harris Agrip.

Records of this Office furnish
no further evidence of disability.
