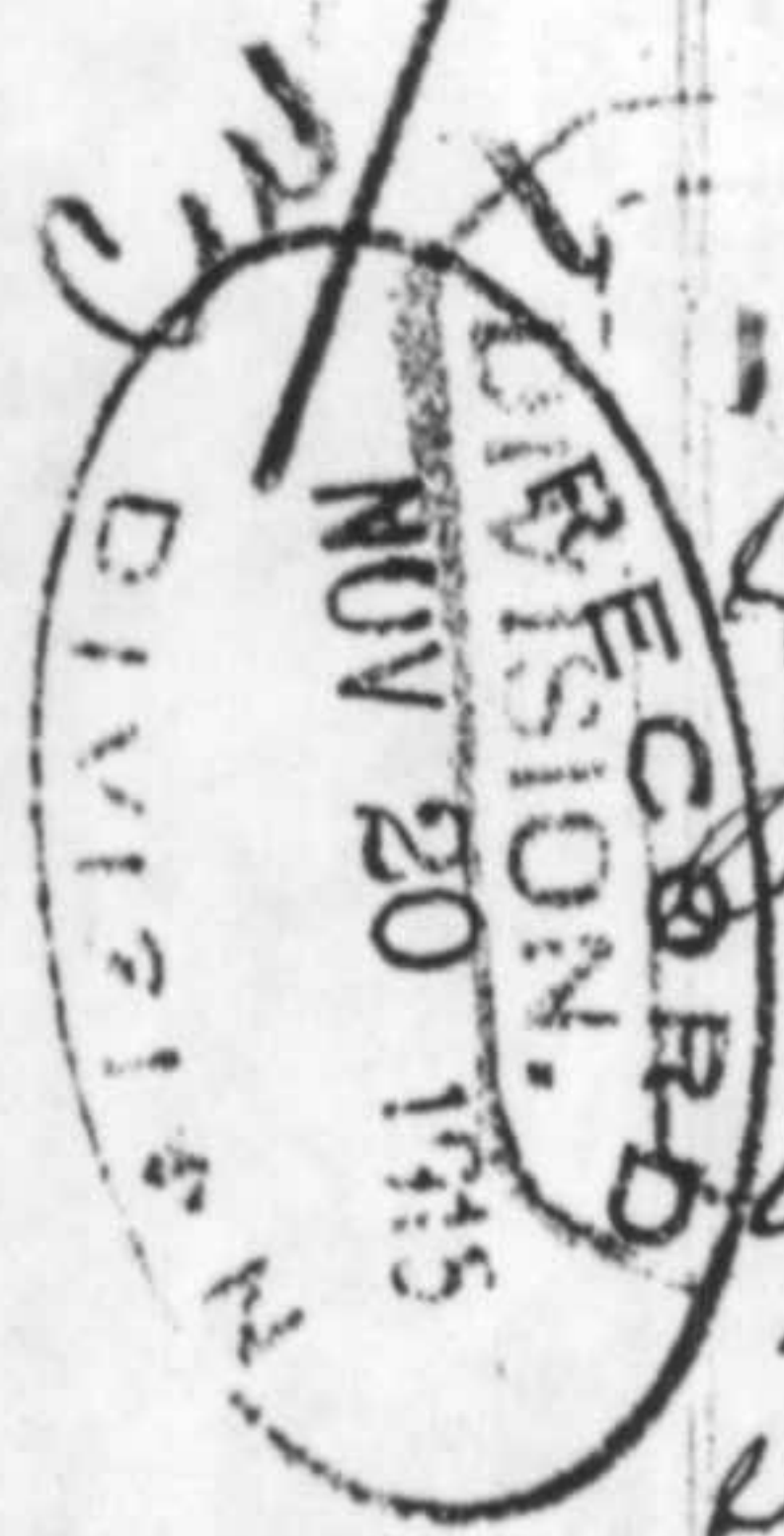




Annapolis. Md. Oct. 19. 1916-
