Sir:

Relative to your above-cited claim for pension under the act of May 11, 1912, filed June 25, 1912, you are advised that further action will not be warranted therein until October 16, 1915, when you will have reached the age of 70 years, from which date you will be entitled to a greater rating under said act than you are now receiving under the general law, \$17 per month.

When you shall have reached the age of 70 years you should inform the Bureau of your then post-office address, and, upon receipt of same, if you are not then in receipt of a greater rate of pension than you would be entitled to under the act of May 11, 1912, a certificate will issue showing the rates to which entitled.

That part of your claim under the disability clause of said act is rejected on the ground that you have not been unable to perform manual labor by reason of rheumatism and resulting disease of heart since the date of filing the claim.

The above-indicated action of rejection is subject to your right of appeal to the Honorable Secretary of the Interior, if the same be taken within one year from date hereof.
