

INABILITY AFFIDAVIT.

D. 1889, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace in and for the aforesaid County, duly authorized to administer oaths Lamine Brice a resident of Annapolis, A. D. County in the County of Anne Arundel and State of Maryland whose Post Office address is Annapolis well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who, being duly sworn, declares in relation to the aforesaid case as follows: That he is unable to comply with the requirements of the Pension Office as to the testimony of Physicians

for the reason that William Brewer who was called after his return from the war is now dead, having died in 1876 and that a steward he employed D. Heaters who was surgeon in the service of the U. S. Army at the time of the war, and who has been residing at Patuxent River in the Physicians office to care him but with no better success.
