Sir:

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your office of application for Pension No. 150,030, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this office, that Joseph Galv was enrolled on the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of Sept, 1863, at Balboh Md., in Co. B, 7<sup>th</sup> Regiment of U.S. Troops Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Priv on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of Sept, 1863, at Baltimore, Md., in Co. B, 7<sup>th</sup> Regiment of U.S. Troops Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the muster-roll of Co. B. of that Regiment for the months of from Organization to Dec 31<sup>st</sup>, 1864, he is reported A private, Present for duty, rolls from Dec 31<sup>st</sup> 1864 to Apr 30<sup>th</sup> 1865 report him, "Detchd. Duty. Seamer. S.O. 2<sup>nd</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> Reg. 2<sup>nd</sup> Div 25<sup>th</sup> Army Corps. Dec 9<sup>th</sup> 1864." rolls from April 30<sup>th</sup> 1865 to August 31<sup>st</sup> 1865 report him, "Absent." Detached Seamer. S.O. 53. Central Dist. of Texas, March 8<sup>th</sup> 1866. Muster Out Roll of Co. dated. In division, Texas. Oct 13<sup>th</sup> 1866. He is reported. Present and mustered out with Company.

There is no evidence on muster rolls of Co. on file in this office, that he was wounded while in service.
