

DEPOSITION

Case of Sarah Gale, No. 150,032

On this 16th day of December, 1889, at
Longwoods, County of Talbot
 State of Md, before me, R. P. Fletcher, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared

John H. Leaver, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: I am 44 years of age - farmer
 R O address Longwoods Md.

I knew this claimant's husband before his in-
 strument was both belonging to the same people.
 Before and up to the time of his instrument
 his health was good, and he had died no in-
 jury to the best of my knowledge and belief.
 I served in Co B - 7th U. S. C 7 from the fall
 of 1863 to March 2nd 1865. I did not meet or
 work with this soldier in service, but knew
 him well during his service.

Q Did this claimant's husband contract any
 disability in service and time of duty?

A I can not give you the date, but we had
 him in the service about a year, that would
 make it about the fall of 1864, while on
 a march from Jacksonville to Baldwin
 Fla. as we were marching along a R.R.
 he sprained his ankle - the right I
 think. I know this because I saw him
 at the time he sprained his ankle; I think
 he caught it in the rail in some way, and
 he was carried the remainder of the
 day in an ambulance. We were encamp-
 at Jacksonville Fla. - about 8 or 10 miles from
 Baldwin. He was off duty and treated
 in his tent, rather reported at sick call
 for some three or four weeks, but was
