DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

State of Maryland, County of Anne Arundel, ss:

On this 18th day of June A. D., one thousand nine hundred and seven
personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the county and
(Title of Officer.)

State aforesaid, Mary Hicks, aged 61 years,
(Name of Claimant.)

a resident of Cothran, County of Anne Arundel

State of Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration
in order to obtain pension under the provisions of the act of Congress approved June 27, 1890, as
amended by act of May 9, 1900.

That she is the widow of Isaac S. Hicks, who was

Enrolled under the name of Isaac S. Hicks,

at Private on the 30th day of October, 1863
as a Private in Co. G, Reg't 7, U.S. Co Vols.

and honorably discharged at Indianapolis Texas, 1866, having served ninety days or more during the late
war of the rebellion. That the soldier was not in the military or naval service of the United States prior to
nor subsequent to

That she was married under the name of Mary Ray to said soldier
at in Calvert County on the 30th day of October, 1863,
by Justice of the Peace, that there was no legal barrier to the marriage;
that she had not been previously married; that the soldier had not been previously married

That the said soldier died May 15th, 1907, at Washington Hospital; Baltimore
that she was not divorced from him; that she has not remarried since his death; and that she is without other
means of support than her daily labor and an actual net income not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars
per annum.
