

GENERAL AFFIDAVIT.

State of Maryland, County of Calvert

In the matter of a claim for Pension by Isaac S. Hicks, Co G. 7th Reg. U.S. C.T.

ON THIS 25th day of April, A. D. 1892, personally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace in and for the aforesaid County, duly authorized to administer oaths Isaac S. Hicks aged 46 years, a resident of Dunkirk in the County of Calvert and State of Maryland well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and

who, being duly sworn, declared in relation to aforesaid case as follows:

During the latter part of my service in the Army and ever since to the present I have been subject to palpitation and other excited action of the heart when moving quickly, or if anything occurs to disturb me. This affects me so that I am unable to do any physical labor for a time, and my friends say my mind is affected during these attacks causing me to act strangely.

This trouble I believe is owing to weariness and fatigue during my service in the Army. To the best of my knowledge and belief the disability is of a permanent character. It is not owing to vicious habits.
