

allegation that she was married
 to soldier May 6, 1880, in
 Baltimore, Md., shows the bride
 to have been a widow and the
 groom a widower. Said copy
 of record also gives name of
 bride as "Agnes Mason" whereas
 claimant alleges marriage
 under the name of Annie E. Moore.
 witnesses state soldier was
 married in about 1872 to
 one Agnes Mason and that
 he had lived with another
 woman also prior to his
 marriage to claimant. Death
 or divorce of the two women
 not shown.

On October 29, 1920, one
 Agnes filed a claim alleging
 marriage to soldier at Washington,
 D.C., in 1873, under the
 name of Agnes Mason. No
 evidence has been filed in
 support of this claim. The
 same requires evidence of
 marriage, non-divorce and
 no prior marriages on the
 part of either.
