ACT OF APRIL 19, 1908, AS AMENDED SEPTEMBER 8, 1916.

State of Maryland, County of Calvert, ss:

ON THIS 10th day of January, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and 1919, personally appeared before me, a Magistrate or Justice of the Peace [Title of officer.]

within and for the County and State aforesaid, Annie E Wilson [Name of claimant.]

who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration in order to obtain a pension under the provisions of the Act of Congress approved April 19, 1908, amended September 8, 1916.

declares that she is 48 years of age, that she was born Nov 1st, 1857, at Baltimore City Maryland [Name of soldier.]

under the name of James Wilson [Name of soldier.]

on the 21st day of October, 1863, as a private in Co. Company H Reg't 7 reg Vols., and honorably discharged 13th day October 1863, having served ninety days or more during the late Civil War.

That she was married under the name of Annie E Moore to said soldier at Baltimore City on the 6th day of May, 1860 by Robert Steele; that there was no legal barrier to the marriage; that she had not been previously married; that the soldier had not been previously married; [Or had not.] [Or had not.]

That the said soldier died December 5th, 1918, at Calvert County Md that she was not divorced from him; that she has not remarried since his death.
