DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

Act of May 1, 1920.

STATE OF Maryland COUNTY OF City of Baltimore, ss:
 On this 28th day of October, 1920, personally appeared before me, a Notary Public
 within and for the County and State aforesaid, Agnes Wilson, who, being duly
 sworn by me according to law, declares that she is 60 years of age and that she was born on or about 1860
 at Island Creek, Calvert County, Maryland
 That she is the widow of James Wilson who enlisted 21 October 1863
 at ?, under the name of James Wilson
 as a Private in Company "H", "7th Regiment
U.S. C.T. Infantry Volunteers
 and was honorably discharged October 13, 1866, having served ninety days or more, or was discharged for
or died in service of a disability incurred in the service and in the line of duty, during the CIVIL WAR.

That he also served Captain Russell Hall Commanded Co. "H"
Certificate was given at Indiana Sta. Texas 13th Oct 1866.
 That she was married to said soldier (or sailor) on or about 1872, under the name
 of Agnes Mason at Washington, D.C.
 by Minister of Methodist Ch. that she had not been previously married; that he had not
 been previously married
James Wilson was married to an unknown
woman about 1900, i.e. the name of the
woman is unknown to Agnes Wilson
 and that neither she nor said soldier (or sailor) was ever married otherwise than as stated above.

(If any former husband rendered military or naval service, here describe same and give number of any pension claim based thereon.)

That said soldier (or sailor) died Dec 5, 1918, at Ben's Creek, Calvert Co., Md.
 that she was not divorced from him; and that she has not remarried since his death.

That the following are the ONLY children of the soldier (or sailor) under sixteen years of age, who are now living, namely:

James Wilson had no children by Agnes
Wilson but he is the father of illegitimate
children.

That the above-named child is of the soldier (or sailor) are now receiving a pension, and that such child is a
member of her family and is cared for by her.

That she has not heretofore applied for pension, the number of her former claim being ?; that said soldier
 (or sailor) was ? a pensioner, the number of his pension certificate being ?

That she makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States under the provisions of the ACT OF MAY 1, 1920.
