1 I certify that I examined the records of the circuit
 2 court clerk of Calvert county Md, on file in his
 3 office at Prince Frederick Md, for the names of James
 4 Wilson and Agnes Wilson with the following result:
 5 Agnes Wilson filed a bill on March 1, 1921 asking for
 6 the sale and division of the property of James Wilson,
 7 the court granted her petition and appointed two trus-
 8 tees to sell the property, etc, property sold, proceeds
 9 not yet divided. The clerk stated that the division
 10 will take place within three weeks after November 28.
 11 James Wilson died intestate. Other heirs are a sister
 12 in Rhode Island, address not stated, and several chil-
 13 dren of a brother of James Wilson. The papers in the
 14 case show the personal property sold for \$285.37, the
 15 expenses of the sale, etc, were \$266.00, leaving a bal-
 16 ance of \$19.37 which was divided as follows: Agnes
 17 Wilson, ~~sister~~, widow, \$9.69, Mary J. Mitchell, sister,
 18 \$9.68. Real estate sold for \$500, not yet divided.
 19 Agnes Wilson showed her widowhood and marriage, etc, by
 20 filing a copy of the license issued to her to marry
 21 James Wilson by the clerk of court of Dist of Columbia,
 22 and a deposition of an eye witness to their marriage -
 23 Mary E. Fisher of 2815 N st, N W, Washington D C.
