

DEPOSITION

Case of Agnes Wilson, No. 1165252.

On this 10th day of August, 1924, at  
City of Washington, county of Washington  
State of Columbia, before me, A. Green,

a Special Examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared  
Ann Maria Wheeler, who, being by me first duly sworn to  
answer truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this special  
examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

1 My full name is Ann Maria Wheeler; age,  
2 well, I don't know; Yes, I remember the Civil War,  
3 am widow of William Wheeler; address; residence  
4 1331 2 yth Street, N. W., Washington City.

5 I know Agnes Wilson of whom inquiry  
6 is made. Her maiden name was Agnes Mason  
7 and she was here with her step-mother, Maria  
8 Mason, Jr., when she married a man named  
9 James Wilson from Calvert County, Maryland.  
10 I never saw him before he married her at my  
11 house, here, 2604 P Street now, West Street  
12 then, and they stayed all night at my home  
13 the night of their marriage, went away the next  
14 morning, bright and early, and I have never  
15 seen him since, but heard from her now and  
16 then and that they separated, I think, an ever-  
17 certain, but never heard they were divorced,  
18 and I saw her last year, the first since  
19 her said marriage. I never knew or  
20 heard that she was married to any other  
21 than to said James Wilson and Rev.  
22 Edgar Murphy, married them at my home  
23 and I was an eye-witness to their  
24 marriage. Rev. Murphy was pastor of Mt.  
25 Zion - which we then called a local  
26 Ministry, (and) we have searched the Church  
27 records but we could not find any record
