On this 28<sup>th</sup> day of September personally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace in and for State and city aforesaid Dr ER Baer who being duly sworn deposes and says. That he now is and has been for about thirty seven years personally acquainted with Frederick C Farr That said Farr during the month of May 1862 was 1<sup>st</sup> Lieutenant and Adjutant of the First Maryland Regiment U S Vols in the service of the United States and had held that position to his personal knowledge since June 1861. Since which last named date said Baer was in service as assistant surgeon of the same regiment. That during months of June (in part) July August & seq in 1862 he was attending said Farr in his capacity as surgeon for wounds received in action at Front Royal Va May 1862. That said wounds are fully described in his affidavit made and filed with said Farr's application for pension. No 193939 That he also knows that said Farr was not afflicted with piles or hemorrhoids during 1861 that piles or hemorrhoids were developed on said Farr during 1862 and 1863 while said Farr was still in the service of the United States. That said disease was progressive and continuous up to 1882. he, Baer, being up to that date family physician to said Farr. That the sabre wound on the head mentioned in affidavit made by him as above stated, completely severed the skull and up to 1885 pulsations were
