John Wesley Owings was enrolled on the *11th* day of
August, 1863, at *Baltimore City Md.*, as a *Private*
in Co. *B*, *4th* Regiment of U. S. Colored *Troops*, to serve *3* years.

He is reported on Muster Roll *from Org. to June 30 for present*
for duty: July & Aug. 64 and to Feby. 28. 65.
"Absent in U. S. S. Hosp. wounded near Peters-
burg Va. June 30/64." March & April 65. and to
Feby 28/66 present for duty.

He was mustered out of service, with Co.
May 4. 1866. at Washington D. C. - a Sergt.
Died Appointed Dist. Dec. 1/65.

He came on some over as John W. Owens.
Brigade report of casualties in the regiment
shows him wounded July 30, 1864 in assault
on Petersburg, Va., nature or location of the wound
not reported.
