 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Lieut Al-
phus R. Long, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: I am 45 years old,
 occupation Agent, P. O. 2247 Lam-
bert St. Philadelphia Pa.

I was 2d Lieut Co H. 9th U.S.C.T.
from Dec 20/63 to Decr. 1864 when
I was promoted to 1st Lieut of Co.
9. same Regiment.

I remember this claimant but
 I cannot remember if he contracted
 any sickness or disease or in-
 curred any disability in the
 service while I was with the
 Company. I have heard stated what
 he alleges but my memory is not
 refreshed, I have no recollection
 of the diseases for which he
 claims.

I know there were no orders
 for the men to bathe in the winter
 season at Benedict. It was too
 cold for the men to bathe, I do
 not remember that any men bathed
 then. Part of the time when at Bene-
 dict Md I had command of the
 Company.
