I was a private in Co. H. 7th
 U.S. C. Y.

I enlisted in the Fall of 1863 and
 was discharged in October 1866
 I served over three years.

I was with the Company until
 I was wounded at Deep Bottom
 in August 1864, I was away nearly
 five months and returned to the
 Company and in one or two months
 I was detailed as Orderly to the
 Colonel and I was with the Regi-
 ment afterwards until discharged
 but not with my company.

I first knew claimant when
 I met him in our Company, I
 never talked with him.

Our Company remained at Benedict
 Md from the organization until
 the following March, about six
 months, and while there this claim-
 ant was sick and was under treat-
 ment of Surgeon Morris of the Regiment
 he was excused from duty and was
 in the Regimental hospital. I don't
