DEPOSITION *6*Case of *Nathaniel Hickman* No. *576.473*

On this *28<sup>th</sup>* day of *April*, 1890, at  
*Philadelphia* County of *Phila*  
 State of *Pa*, before me, *W E Clapp*, a  
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared *George W*  
*Clarkson*, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer  
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid  
 pension claim, deposes and says: *My name is George W*  
*Clarkson*, my age is *47* years, I am  
 a *Methodist* Clergyman, and am  
 now located at *Daylestown Bucks Co*  
*Pa*

I was a member of Co. H - 4 U.S.C  
 T, the regiment was raised at Ben-  
 edict Md. I was present with the  
 company, during the winter of 1863  
 and 1864, we lay in front of Peter-  
 burg Va. I remember Nathaniel  
 Hickman as a member of the  
 same company and regiment,  
 I did not know him prior to his  
 army service.

I cannot recollect any disease  
 or disability that he contracted  
 while I was with him in the  
 service. Neither can I say that  
 he did not contract any disease  
 in the army.

I have heard read the allegations  
 of the claimant relative to the nature  
 of the diseases contracted, and the  
 manner, and place of their occur-  
 rence, and it fails to refresh my  
 memory.
