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healthy at the time he lived
in this neighborhood

After hearing his statement in
which he alleges effects of pleurisy and
pneumonia, rheumatism and hemorrhage,
brain fever and palsy I do not recollect
of hearing of any one or all of said diseases
as affecting him.

He did not do much work while he
lived here. I think he made his home
with his mother most of the time. I
know I would meet him at church and
other places about twice a month or
so while he lived here. I never worked
with him.

There is no one here in the neighborhood
that I can think of who was an intimate
friend or associate or fellow workman of
him while he lived here after the
war. People have died and got scattered
who lived here then.

I have understood the questions asked
and my answers thereto have been
correctly recorded in this deposition.
