DEPOSITION

Case of Nathanial Hickman, No. 576473

On this 23rd day of May, 1890, at
Jersey City, County of Hudson
 State of New Jersey, before me, B. R. Chapp, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared

Amos Robbins, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says:

I am about 43 years of
 age; residence 55 Slater Ave. Jersey City
 N. J. and am a varnish maker.

I was private of Co. D.
 of the 7th Reg. N. J. I. from
 November 1863 to November 1866. Having
 served my full term of three years.

I remember the claimant
 Nathanial Hickman as one of my
 comrades; don't think now that
 we were tent mates; I cannot
 now recall his condition in any
 respect while in the service, whether
 he was weak or strong, sick or well
 or complaining of any disease or not
 while there. Cannot recollect of
 anything distinctly affecting him while
 in the service.

He alleges several complaints -
 that he contracted diseases in the service
 and line of duty - can you recall anything
 with reference to his condition.

Oh yes now it does occur
 to me that Hickman was in hospital
 several times. I cannot tell where now -
 seems to me it was at Hampton -
 can't say what year or month that was
