H. Warrin, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: I am about 43 years old
 Residence 113 E. Mulberry St this city
 Manufacturer of "Indian Metal Polish"
 Enlisted in Co. H. 7th U.S. C.T.S. in Dec 1864
 and served in that Co. 1 Reg until the
 regiment was mustered out in 1866
 Did not know claimant prior to my en-
 listment, then knew him the same as
 I knew many other who belonged to
 my company,
 Do not remember that claimant was
 sick in the service.
 Do remember that he, after I joined the
 regiment, looked about the same as he
 does to day, that is, like a man who
 has consumption, this is all I recall
 of him while in service.
 Baltimore City has been my home ever since
 I was discharged from the army.
 Did not see claimant after discharge for some
 time, two or three years, can't say exactly.
 Since I first saw him after discharge I have seen
 him quite often, say about once a month,
 perhaps oftener, and each time I saw him
 he looked about as before stated, as if he had
 consumption, but I really do not know
 what disease he had or has, nor can I
 state any symptoms of disease. &c
