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pain in left breast which I thought  
was pleurisy.

Do not recall that claimant was lame  
or had rheumatism in service.

Know that claimant was all the time  
complaining of a pain in his left breast  
and that he had a cough nearly all  
the time he was in service.

Have since about 1869 or 1870, seen  
claimant on an average (3) three  
times each year, and each time  
I saw him he had a cough, complained  
of his head, walked slowly and as if he  
could hardly get around. he also has  
complained of shortness of breath, that  
he also did in the army.

My opinion is that since 1869, claim-  
ant has for each year been more than  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  totally disabled for manual labor  
by reason of disease contracted at  
Benedict Mo. in 1863, and at Jacksonville  
Fla in 1864.

Am not related to claimant, or interested  
in this claim for pension.
