DEPOSITION *M*Case of *Nathan Hickman*, No. 576,473

On this *14* day of *Dec*, 1889, at
Baltimore, County of *City*
 State of *MD*, before me, *J. E. S. Conry*, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared *Nathan*
Hickman, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: in addition to former state-
 ments, that when he was discharged from the army
 in Oct 1866, he returned to Accomac Co. Va
 and to ~~my~~ Mother's house, she lived on Mr
 Perry Moors place near Sea side Landing, Accomac Co. Va
 and remained there until ^{about} New Years day
 1867, when my mother moved on to a place
 owned by Mr George Warner (don't know whether
 he is living or dead) situated about ($\frac{1}{4}$) one fourth
 of a mile from Mr. Moors place.
 I was sick while on Mr Warner's place
 and Louisa Bloxam, now Waters, tended
 me. Was sick about (3) three months
 with rheumatism, in hands & legs, diarrhoea,
 Cough, and sores all over me, and leaving
 from Mr Warner's place in the last of 1867. I went
 to my old Master's place. Richd & Hickman,
 now dead, remained with him one year about.
 Then I was sick while at Master's for 3, or
 4 months, with, Colds, misery in side, head,
 rheumatism, hemorrhages ^{of lungs} and ^{and scurvy} ~~hemorrhages~~
 and a fever. From Master I went to
 Mr Thos Correll at Ouanacock, Va. was
 with him about six months, did only lighter
 work, suffered with same afflictions while
 with him.

I left Mr Correll and came to Baltimore
 City Md about the last of 1869.
