

State of Maryland City of Baltimore. On this 6th
 day of November A.D. 1886 before me a Justice of the Peace
 personally appeared Nathaniel ~~Stickman~~ ^{Stickman} late private
 Co (H) 7th United States Colored Troops residing at no 104 Tyson
 street 3rd door south of Madison street (sometimes called Dickerson)
 who having been duly sworn deposes and says he enlisted on the 3rd
 day of November 1863 Commanded by Capt Russell Hall & was dis-
 charged at Indianola Texas on the 13 of October 1864 - who having been
 by me duly sworn says - He has resided in Baltimore Maryland
 for twelve years ~~and thereabouts~~, first lived in no 110 Church
 street Federal Hill Baltimore for about a year, then 282 North
 Howard street Baltimore - for about a year - then lived Russel
 Alley no 12 - between Sharp & Howard Baltimore for about four years,
 then went to Court House Lane next to ^{St Clair} Carrollton Hotel about a
 year, then at no 5 Jasper street about two years, then at no 20
 Bolton street between Preston & Bidole for about six months, then
 in Chestnut alley about a year - then at no 42 N. Calver
 street (old number with a family called Jones) & was there two years and
 on N. Howard street no 326 for some few months - then on Tyson
 street no 104 near Madison street where I have been for some
 three months & it is here I now reside, prior to the above times
 lived in Baltimore - & just after my discharge I lived in
 Accomac Virginia on Mr. Geo. Warners Land sea side in the
 Capacity of workman as far as I was able the most of the time I
 was sick. From my discharge to the present time I have been a suf-
 ferer from Rheumatism ^{& Hemorrhage} I was first attacked with ~~then~~ Pneum-
 onia & Pleurisy at Benedict from the effect of being compelled to go
 in bathing in November 1863 in the month of December 1863 I was
 sent to the Hospital called Benedict Hospital & was there several months
 sick - I was then sent Hilton-head - S. Carolina where I was sick still
 & I was then sent sick to Jacksonville Florida where I was constantly
 sick with hemorrhages & I performed no duty - I was sent with my Regiment
 in front of Charleston where I was still on the sick list & did no
