1st Sergeant and 1st Sergeant of Co. H. 7th U.S. C 7th Ar. That he served with his said Company and Regiment, continuously on Active duty from the date of enlistment in October 1863 to the date of the Muster out of Regt Oct 13th 1866.

That he recollects the Claimant Nathaniel Hickman a private of said Company & Regt. and does know of his own personal knowledge that whilst the said Company was encamped at Benedict Maryland from about December 1863 to about March 1864 the Claimant Nathaniel Hickman was a severe sufferer with the Mumps, the left side of the neck was swollen and evidently painful, he also complained of pain in his back, was quite weak. And in fact seldom fit for other than the lightest duty. I might say that from the time he incurred the disability at the time and place aforesaid; until his discharge he was a chronic invalid.

From 1866 to date 1891. The Dependent and Claimant have both lived in Baltimore Md. would meet or hear of him at frequent intervals. his debilitated condition has continued to grow worse, until now he is absolutely totally prostrated and helpless. The result as he claims of Army Service he further declare that he has no interest in said case, and is not concerned in its prosecution.
