& Nose - at Benedict had Pneumonia & Mumps & at some
periods he could not walk & he was in a sickly state when
he was discharged & such is his condition now - The
state of facts has been ever since his discharge to the present
time. I have seen him on an average two & sometimes
three times a month. He has not been able to follow
any hard work - His habits were always good &
I believe Claimant a worthy man.
