and entitled to credit, and who, being duly sworn, declare in relation to aforesaid claim, as follows:

That they
each for themselves say that the well known
Josiah Baiscoe the Applicant, and they have personal
and perfect knowledge that he was wounded
in the following manner to wit:

That while at Johns
Island in South Carolina their Regiment received
a white Regiment about 8 o'clock in the morning
of July 9th 1864, when the enemy fired upon us
and a Mining Ball struck Josiah Baiscoe upon
the Head, and that he lay unconscious about 15 minutes
after which he was removed to the Hospital at Beaufort
S.C. and that also on or about the 29th day
of September 1864 after our return from South Carolina
our Regiment was on the right of Fort Harrison Va
when we was on the Picket Line Josiah Baiscoe
was struck upon the Index finger of the Right
Hand causing away part of said finger.
Our means of knowing of said
facts are as follows. I Thomas Proctor was a
Quartermaster of Co. I, 7th Regt Col. Troops, and I John
Young was a member of Co. I, 7th Regt
and were personally present at the time
the wounds were received

We... further declare that... we have no interest in said claim, and are not concerned in its
prosecution.
