SIR:

Your inquiry of Feb^y. 16th, 1883, in Pension Claim No. 455,258, is herewith returned, with the following information:

Philip Garrison was enrolled on the 16th day of Jan^y, 1864, at Kent Co. Md., as a Private 1st in Co. "K", 7th Regiment of U. S. Colored Troops, to serve 3 years.

He is reported on Muster Roll from Dec. 31. 63 to June 30. 64 present for duty; July & Aug. absent; "In Hosp. wounded Bermuda & Andrea since Aug. 14. 1864"; Sept & Oct. absent; "Hosp. wounded Aug. 14. 1864"; Nov & Dec. 1864 to Aug. 31. 66 present for duty; He was mustered out of service with Co. Oct. 13. 66 at Indianola, Texas.

Co. Returns for Oct & Nov. 64 show him absent wounded in Hosp. Davis Island N.Y. since Aug. 14. 1864. Co. morning reports Dec. 10. 64 show him returned from absent sick. List of *wounded in Brigade of Colored Troops 10th A. C. shows him Wounded on knee near Deep Bottom Va. Nature of wound not shown by the records of this office.
