That he was well acquainted with

John W. Anderson, the Soldier, from his youth up to his death, That affiant enlisted in U.S. Military Service in January (day not remembered) 1864, and joined Company C. 9 Regt U.S. Col. Inf. Vol. and met the said Soldier John W. Anderson at Benedict in same month, and met said Soldier as a member of Co. F. 7th U.S. C. S. in the same Brigade as myself and am satisfied that said Soldier was ~~not~~ in the U.S. Military ~~or~~ ^{or} service prior to January 16-1864 and belonged to Co. F. 7th U.S. C. S. That said Soldier was Ward master prior to January 16th. 1864 but cannot remember how long before that date he went into the military service - He left Chestertown in the latter part of 1863 to the best of my recollection -
