

Mary E. Hanson deposes and says that she has been acquainted with the family many years, that she visited the family of the soldier frequently since soldiers death. That she was present a short time before the child Nettie Frances Louise, the daughter of the above named soldier died, and soon after she died, on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of July 1903. She attended the funeral and saw the child buried. She the child died in Chestertown, Maryland.

Ella G. Dorsey deposes and says that she has known soldiers family many years. That she and Benena, the widow of soldier, were children together. Frequently visited the family. Visited the family during the death sickness of their daughter Nettie Frances Louise who died in July 1903. Do not recollect the day. Was at the funeral at their home in Chestertown, Maryland, saw the corpse of the child. Did not see it buried. She left home for the family while they went to bury the child.
