In the claim for original  
Invalid Pension No. 655,231, of Wesley Broad-  
way. The claimant, in compliance with the  
requirements of the annexed Pension Office  
Circular declares that his place of residence  
P. O. address, has been Chestertown, County of  
Kent, State of Maryland, and his occupation  
has been that of a Seaman and a laborer, res-  
pectively, during the period from his discharge  
to the present time. That while serving as  
a private in Co. "A", 7<sup>th</sup> Regt. U. S. C. T., in the  
military service of the United States, in the  
war of the Rebellion, and without fault or  
improper conduct of his own, at or near Jackson-  
ville, State of Florida, on or about 11 March, 1864  
(as near as can recollect) he had Dyspepsia, caused  
from subsisting on unwholesome army rations, ac-  
-gravated by hardships incident to the service;  
That on or about Aug. 16<sup>th</sup>, 1864, (as near as can  
recollect) in action, at Peep Bottom, State of  
Virginia, he incurred gunshot wounds of thigh  
of right leg (and resulting rheumatism, caused  
from exposure) That, while in the service aforesaid  
he was treated for the Dyspepsia by Asst. Surgeon  
Geol. Morse, who was, afterwards, on or about 11 Jan  
27<sup>th</sup>, 1866, at or near Brownsville, State of Tennessee
