Daily, on an average. I knew him a long time before he returned. If he has continued to suffer with such disability, please describe the symptoms which were apparent to you, and state to what extent he has been disabled for manual labor thereby during each year?

Answer:

He has continued to suffer therefrom ever since. The symptoms are as described above. I do not believe him to be ~~at~~ one-half man.
