



# WIDOW'S DECLARATION FOR PENSION OR INCREASE OF PENSION.

This must be Executed before a Court of Record or some Officer thereof having Custody of the Seal.

State of Maryland, City of Baltimore, ss:

ON THIS 10<sup>th</sup> day of February, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and Ninety two, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland, a Court of Record within and for the County and State aforesaid, Sarah E. Martin, aged 35 years, who being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration in order to obtain the Pension provided by Acts of Congress granting pension to widows: That she is the widow of Richard Martin, who

under the name of Richard Martin, at \_\_\_\_\_, on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, A. D. 18 \_\_\_\_\_, in Co. D. 30<sup>th</sup> Regt. U.S. Inf. Vols. also Landsman U.S. Navy. (Company and Regiment of Service, if in the Army; or Vessel and Rank, if in the Navy.)

in the war of Rebellion, who Died from disease contracted from Army Service (State nature of wounds, and all circumstances attending them, or the disease and manner in which it was incurred, in either case showing soldier's death to have been the sequence.)

on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of June, A. D. 18 81, who bore at the time of his death the rank of \_\_\_\_\_ in \_\_\_\_\_; ("In the service aforesaid," or otherwise.)

that she was married under the name of Sarah E. Stanely to said Richard Martin, on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of January A. D. 18 73, by Rev James Thomas, at Baltimore Md., there being no legal barrier to such marriage; that neither she nor her husband had been previously married (If either have been previously married, so state, and give date of death or divorce of former spouse.)

; that she has to present date remained his widow; that the following are the names and dates of birth of all his legitimate children yet surviving who were under sixteen years of age at father's death, viz: Yvette Martin born July 11<sup>th</sup> 1875.

that she has not abandoned the support of any one of her children, but that they are still under her care or maintenance. (For such children as are not under her care claimant should account.)

that she has not in any manner engaged in, or aided or abetted, the rebellion in the United States; that A, prior application has been filed That she is a pensioner under (If prior application has been filed, either by soldier or widow, so state, Certif No. 294,967. Act June 27, 1890)

; that she hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation, Charles J. Davis of Baltimore City Md., her attorney, to prosecute the above claim; that her residence is No. 410. Regester. street and her Post Office address is Baltimore City Maryland.
