Q. 2 In your sworn statement before me of yesterday, the  
3 26<sup>th</sup>, instant, you stated that you were married to  
4 John C. Bailey on December 22<sup>nd</sup>, 1890, by the Rev.  
5 Mr. Dehann, etc., etc. Now state whether you were  
6 married in church.

A. 7 No Sir; we were married at the parsonage. There were  
8 no witnesses present at said marriage, only the house-  
9 keeper of the ministry, but she is dead.

Q. 10 Referring to Hester Granger the alleged second wife of  
11 John C. Bailey, please state whether Hester had been  
12 married before her marriage to him.

A. 13 Yes Sir, she had. She had been married to Charley  
14 Granger. Charley Granger is dead. He died before  
15 Hester married John C. Bailey, but he had only been  
16 dead a few months when John C. & Hester got married.  
17 No Sir, I did not personally know Charley Granger but I  
18 knew of him & I know I heard of his death before John  
19 C. Bailey and Hester were married.

Q. 20 Was the alleged first wife, Jone, living at the time John  
21 C. Bailey married Hester?

A. 22 Yes Sir. I know that because I saw Jone twice after  
23 John C. Bailey separated from Hester. I saw her both  
24 times at Camp meetings here and I was with John C.  
25 Bailey at the time and he called my attention to her.
