

GENERAL AFFIDAVIT

State of Maryland, Baltimore City, to wit:

BE IT REMEMBERED, That on this 4<sup>th</sup> day of February

A. D. 1914, before me the subscriber a Justice of the Peace

of the said State, in and for the City aforesaid, personally appeared Sarah V. Riley, Widow of Robert Riley, late of Co. "B" 7<sup>th</sup> U.S.C. Inf P.O. Centerville Maryland, R.D. #3

and made oath in due form of law that I am the lawful Widow of the above named deceased Soldier, and do say that I was married but one time, prior to my marriage to him, my former marriage was dissolved <sup>by divorce</sup> prior to my marriage to the late Robert Riley, and with whom I lived from the date of our marriage till the date of his death. We were never divorced. Neither have I remarried since his death. My late husband had been married two times, prior to his marriage to me. Both of said marriages were dissolved by death, and prior to our marriage to each other, the Soldier died leaving no minor child or children surviving by either of his three marriages.
