Sir:

In response to your call of the 24th, received the 26th ultimo (GHL-319-450210), relative to the identity of Henry Worrell, of Box 196, Chestertown, Md., as private and corporal, Co. D, 7th U. S. C. Vol. Inf., Inv. Ctf. No. 799778, you are advised that William H. Barrett and William Landing, of Chestertown, Md., testified in a declaration for pension filed by Henry Worrell October 6, 1910, that they were present and saw the claimant make his mark to the said declaration, and that they had every reason to believe, from the appearance of the claimant and their acquaintance with him for sixty and thirty-five years, respectively, that he was the identical person he represented himself to be.

Pensioner stated in a declaration for pension filed August 21, 1890, that he was the identical Henry Worrell who was enrolled September, 1863, in Co. D, 7th Regiment U. S. C. Troops, and was honorably discharged at Baltimore, in November, 1866.
