I have had trouble with my right limb + side ever since I was injured before Petersburg in 1864 I was relieved from active duty by my Captain whose name was Thomas Carter + detailed to serve in the wagon train I got apparently well + did not suffer any real effects of my injury until sometime in 1879 when I had to stop work on the farm + went to sailing on a Boat but soon was compelled to give that up also, the Rheumatism appears to grow worse + at times I am a great sufferer + I fully believe that it is the result of injury while in the service + I further depose + say that it is in no wise due to my vicious habits

and I further declare that I am no interest in said case, and am not concerned in its prosecution.
