AN ACT

To increase the pension of widows, minor children, and so forth, of deceased soldiers and sailors of the late Civil War, the war with Mexico, the various Indian wars, and so forth, and to grant a pension to certain widows of the deceased soldiers and sailors of the late Civil War.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SEC. 2. That if any officer or enlisted man who served ninety days or more in the Army or Navy of the United States during the late Civil War, and who has been honorably discharged therefrom, has died, or shall hereafter die, leaving a widow, such widow shall, upon due proof of her husband's death, without proving his death to be the result of his army or navy service, be placed on the pension roll from the date of the filing of her application therefor under this Act at the rate of twelve dollars per month during her widowhood, provided that said widow shall have married said soldier or sailor prior to June twenty-seventh, eighteen hundred and ninety; and the benefits of this section shall include those widows whose husbands, if living, would have a pensionable status under the Joint Resolution of February fifth, 1862, and the Act of March
